I. Academic Requirements

- Thursday, April 15, 2021
 - All correspondence and independent study credits must be completed and received by the grade level counselor and registrar
 - Students will check with their teachers and counselors to see if they are passing all required courses
- Friday, April 30, 2021
 - Students should be on track to earn the required number of credits
 - Students will double-check with their teachers and counselors to see if they are passing all courses required for graduation.

II. Financial Obligations

- Students must have cleared all financial obligations by Wednesday, May 19, 2021 at 3:30pm (class dues, KSG, JROTC, etc.)
- Students must have cleared all current textbook, library book, and/or equipment obligations

III. Behavior Requirements

- Chapter 19 behavior requirements/expectations must be adhered to in order to participate in the Commencement Ceremony on May 22, 2021
- A student may lose his/her graduation privilege, if he/she commits a Chapter 19 offense that results in a suspension that bridges all or part of the fourth quarter. Please remember that possession, use, or sale of electronic cigarettes or associated paraphernalia will result in a suspension per school policy.

Chapter 19 Class C or D offenses:

Class D offenses (School prohibited)

- Possession of contraband
- Use of contraband

IV. Proper Conduct

- Commencement and Song Practices are on Thursday, May 20nd and Friday, May 21st
 - Practices are mandatory. Usually in the Gym from 8:30 a.m. 2:30 p.m.
 - All students who commit to participate in the Commencement Ceremony on Saturday, May 22, 2021 are required to attend practice on both days (including part-time students, Fall 2020 graduates, walking juniors, etc.)
- All school rules must be followed
 - Commencement practices and the ceremony are school-sponsored events
- Please leave personal belongings at home
 - Your personal belongings (purses, backpacks, yearbooks, etc.) cannot be safely secured. You assume personal risk of your items being lost, stolen, or vandalized

V. Commencement Dress Code

- Students shall conform to the school dress code at all times
- Boys
 - Dark covered shoes (no slippers)
 - Dark long pants
 - White-collared shirt (long- or short-sleeved)
- Girls
 - White dress or white pants with a white top (must meet school dress code)
 - White shoes (sandals okay, no slippers)
- No alterations may be made to the cap or gown
 - Detachable alterations will be removed before the ceremony begins
 - A student with alterations that cannot be removed will not participate in the ceremony

Special Considerations due to COVID restrictions:
